### **Time to Reflect**

We know this passage well. It's an analogy that has passed into modern day speech, separating the sheep from the goats, the good from the bad.

It's not so much a story, a parable, as a piece of teaching. Lots of repetition, banging the message home.

So we have got the message, be a sheep not a goat....

What does that message mean to us, sitting in lockdown in the twenty-first century?

Each and every one of us is made in the image of God.

When we move into action for good that is God shining through us.

If we deny that action, if we turn away with some excuse, we are not recognizing that image of God in ourselves.

We are not recognizing the image of God in other people who we may have been able to help.

For those who God calls "blessed", those who step forward into action, it's not just the doing of the action, but the encouragement that the action spreads for others to do likewise.

Of course, the reverse is true - if we deny the image of God within us, if we turn away from an opportunity, if we bury our head in the sand, then that gesture gives permission for those around us to do the same - nothing is accomplished, everything goes on in the same old way.

The things we do change others for good or ill - not just the ones we help or don't help, but those who stand by and watch.

People can be incited by all sorts of activities. We have all seen how evil can duplicate rapidly because of what others say, the social media is a good example of this, but long before social media was ever thought of I can think of situations in school or work where malicious gossip changed people's lives.

The opposite can also be true, people can be swept along to join in a helpful action, making a difference in communities because of the example of others.

All because of the image of God within us.

Surrounded as we are today, by confusion, fear and uncertainty I find it very easy to bury that image under my own concerns, to ignore the God within me.

"What would be best for me" replaces "what is God asking of me".

Because so many things have changed, we have to look for new ways to project God's image within us. Inside and outside the church we are called to show kindness.

The challenge is to find opportunities to do so in our different circumstances but find them we must, if we are to live out the image of God in us.
